Generosity is an Act of WORSHIP

We believe generosity is a sacred response to God's abundant grace—a form of worship that lifts our hearts in thanksgiving. As John Wesley taught, all we have is from God, and giving is our way of saying, "Thank You." Through the Lead With Love campaign and every offering we make—whether time, skill, prayer, or financial resources—we honor the Giver of all good things and participate in God's unfolding work.

Generosity is a Path of DISCIPLESHIP in Faith

Generosity shapes us. It forms our hearts, stretches our trust, and transforms us into disciples who rely on God rather than our own security. When we lead with love through generous commitments, we learn to step into a deeper faith—trusting that God provides, sustains, and multiplies what we offer.

Generosity is SERVING Others

Living generously means putting love into action. It is offering ourselves in service to God and neighbor. At Floris UMC, this is seen in our hunger ministries, our care for the vulnerable, our support of families, our outreach to the community, and our work in the world. In Lead With Love, we serve through giving, knowing our generosity fuels the ministry that touches lives every day.

Generosity is SHARING Our Faith

Generosity is a witness to Christ. When we lead with love, we show the world that we follow a Savior who gave everything for love of humanity. Our generosity becomes a declaration of hope, demonstrating that the Floris UMC is a place where love is lived, shared, and extended to all.

Key Generosity Terms

Tithe – A tithe is the biblical practice of giving one-tenth of one's income to support the work of the church and its ministries.

Offerings – Our offerings are our gifts given through the church to ministries and missions that transform the lives for the glory of God, that are beyond our tithes. As followers of Jesus, we freely and prayerfully offer these gifts as additional offerings. An example of an offering is our Christmas Eve Giving.

Estimate of Giving (EOG) – This is a heartfelt estimate to contribute a specific amount of money over a set period, usually one year. This estimate helps the church plan its ministry activities by providing a predictable stream of income. An Estimate of Giving can be adjusted as circumstances change, reflecting the giver's financial ability and spiritual commitment to supporting the church's mission and ministries.

Annual Ministry Budget – a plan that outlines our expected income and expenses for a year.

Proportional Giving – sharing a percentage of income as a grateful response to what God has given us and to help build the Kingdom of God by creating a more just, inclusive, loving, world.

In Luke 12:48 Jesus shares "...to who much is given, much will be required." This text illuminates a theme throughout the bible that we are responsible to steward the time, talents and (not or) financial resources in proportion to how we have been blessed by God's goodness.
